New Jersey Survivor Tuition Benefits Program & Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Scholarship



The Survivor Tuition Benefits Program (STB) helps eligible children and surviving spouses of New Jersey firefighters, emergency service workers and law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty earn a bachelor's degree.

Eligibility

Students must:

- Be a child or surviving spouse of a New Jersey firefighter, emergency service worker or law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty
- Be citizens, eligible non-citizens or eligible to file the NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application
- Be enrolled at least half-time in an undergraduate program at an approved New Jersey college, university or degree-granting proprietary school during the Fall and/or Spring semester(s) only
 - Summer term available in limited circumstances
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- Not have received the maximum number of payments (8)
 - * Eligibility to apply is limited to eight years from the date of the child's high school graduation, with no time limit to apply for surviving spouses.

Benefits

The STB award provides students with free tuition at any public institution of higher education in New Jersey and pays for enrollment at participating independent institutions in New Jersey. The award amount cannot exceed the highest tuition charged at a New Jersey public institution. Approved institutions are listed in this brochure. Awards are renewable. Scholarships depend on available funding.

The Law Enforcement Officer Memorial (LEOM) Scholarship benefits dependent children of New Jersey law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

Eligibility

Students must:

- Be a dependent child of a New Jersey law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty
- Be citizens, eligible non-citizens or eligible to file the NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application
- Be enrolled full-time in an undergraduate degree program at an approved New Jersey college, university or degree-granting proprietary school during the Fall and/or Spring semester(s) only
 - Summer term available in limited circumstances
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
 - * Students who have received the maximum number of payments (8) are not eligible.

Benefits

The LEOM scholarship covers up to the cost of attendance, less other scholarships, grants, benefits and other assistance awarded under HESAA statute.

Application Deadlines

Fall and Spring terms:

- October 1st of the academic year for which aid is requested

Spring term only:

- March 1st of the academic year for which aid is requested

Summer term:

- May 1st of the academic year for which LEOM or STB has already been received

Summer Eligibility is available in limited circumstances:

- Must be graduating at the end of the summer term in the same academic year that you received an LEOM or STB payment in the fall or spring
- Have not received the maximum number of payments (8)
- Must be enrolled at least full time for LEOM or at least half time for STB
